Custom Disposal

We were able to sign a 2-year contract with Custom Disposal at a lower rate than originally quoted. At first, we were told that the service would go up from 15.95 to 18.95 per unit but after discussing with owner we were able to negotiate the unit price down to 17.25 per unit which is a savings for the year of \$1,428.00. Just a reminder that all trash recycling needs to be on curb by 6:00am. Recycling materials are as follows. Paper which includes newspaper, magazines, office paper, envelopes, carton board, cereal boxes, shoes boxes and tin and aluminum cans. All containers need to be left with unit when moving or new homeowner will be charged. Rolling carts \$60 each, 18-gallon recycle bins are \$10 each. The contract does not cover yard debris or vegetative waste being picked up. However, those items may be collected at the expense of the homeowner for \$1.25 per biodegradable lawn bag. You will need to call Custom Disposal directly at 770-977-2788 and number is also on your trash can.

3rd Quarter Financial Review

We had a challenging third Quarter which has always been the case. We have big tickets items that are due, Painting, Master Dues, Termite control and with the unexpected irrigation repairs our operating budget was hurting and in order to be able to pay all our expenses in September we had to borrow \$7,500 to cover expenses from the Reserve account. The goal is to pay back these funds at the end of the year based on our projections for the remaining year.

The total irrigations repairs will be \$22,935.75 which includes the start-up and closing of the irrigation system. After moving other items budgets to cover the Irrigation we were at \$15,676.00 and had a shortfall of (\$7,259.75)

Wood Rot- At the end of year repairs were \$ 3,780.00 which we only budgeted \$2,000. We are over budget (\$1,780.00). Next year we have increased this budget to \$4K

Irrigation- We are pleased to say that our irrigation bills have decreased due to the Master rain sensor. We are under budget \$1,814.66.

Water/Sewer- We had hoped providing homeowners with Irrigation 3 times a week would help reduce some of W/S bills but as of September we are overstated (\$1,102.52) We had ask homeowners if they did have to water grass to do it by hand instead of using a sprinkler.

Wells Fargo Reserve Account

Since we opened the new Wells Fargo Reserve account in June 2019, we have received \$536.69 in interest. We were not able to transfer to monthly \$5,441.80 in September to the Reserve due to the shortfall for the monthly expenses but in October we will be transferring 2 months \$ 10,883.60

Wooden Fence- Our plans were to replace the wooden fence at the rear of the community in October but the Vendor failed to provide us with all the insurance documentation that we requested. The wooden fence will now be included in the 2020 Capital expenditures.

Recap of the Reserve History account:

From 2006-2014 the Builder had only contributed \$18,946 which was only 2%.

From 2015-2019(end of year) we would have contributed to the Reserve \$257,175.81 which does not includes interest for the remaining year yet. We have come a long way in just 4 years.

From 2017-2019 we have had a total of \$137,043.27 in Capital expenditures. At the end of the year not including interest we should have at least \$139,078.54 in the Reserve.

 Amendments
 - Fitness Center usage now mirrors Pool usage in that a homeowner must be present with any guests

Answer- We will look into it.

Caryl Hanlon - Getting back to Gutters- Some of us get more leaves in their gutters than others. Will we get more cleanings? What can we do?

Answer- Email the BOD and we will call the gutter people.

Caryl Hanlon - We will have \$4000 for landscape need next year. What is the process to get landscape help?

Answer- Email the BOD and they will send it to the Landscape committee to decide.

Ted Manley - What is the state of the rental #38?

Answer- The owner is staying current with the COA dues with reminders monthly. They have been charged late fees when late. They still have the same tenant there. Michael and Marcy talked with him just last week.

Doug Barron - There is a pole across from my house what is it?

Answer- We were asked by suite 8 to get better lighting back there. We had gotten an estimate from Cobb EMC and when we were ready to act on it the cost had gone way up. We could not

afford to do it. We reached out to the Townhouses and see if they would share the cost and they said no.

- Architectural Modification Requests since last COA meeting
 - Brush clean & seal the stone and brick facing on the unit cleaning approved, sealing disapproved
 - Install Anderson 4000 storm doors on front and back of unit approved
 - Renovate existing rear deck, railing, & steps approved
- Clarification regarding submission of Modification Requests
 - As stated on the Request Form, the Form must be submitted if the proposed modifications involve structural, electrical, or plumbing changes to a unit.
 - However, if an electrical or plumbing change will be made inside a unit but not inside its walls, then a Request Form is not required; examples may include replacing ceiling lights/fans and garbage disposers.
 - Nevertheless, regardless of the scale of the planned change, when an outside contractor is to be hired to make changes to a unit, the homeowner should make sure that the contractor is insured for General Liability and Workers Compensation.
- The ABC is developing an Incident Response Checklist, in order to help homeowners respond to incidents involving damage to property or injury to persons. (Please contact Chip Nimick, ABC chair, if you have ideas that you would like to contribute to this checklist.)

Finance Committee Lydia Dumas

We have been very busy working on the Budget and the Reserve Study. We work very closely with the BOD. We looked at the budget and approved it. We also approved the moving of \$7500 from the Reserve account to the Operating Account to cover the irrigation bills.

We are working very diligently on the Reserve Study. We as a community voted not to pay for another Reserve Study so each Finance Committee member has an assignment to research the major items that will be coming up and ones that will come up in the future. We are finding it hard to get estimates on end of life items such as roofs, roads etc. Example roofs are expected to last approximately 23 years. We are using a Government Index which helps to calculate prices with inflation considered.
